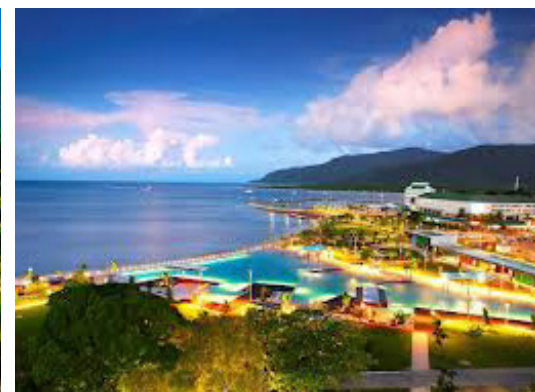

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Abel J. González

Vice-Chairman of ICRP;
Representative at UNSCEAR

Abel Julio González is an Academician, member of the Argentine Academy of Environmental Sciences and the Argentine Academy of the Seas. Currently, he holds the following positions:

- Representative at the United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation.
- Member of the Commission of Safety Standards of the International Atomic Energy Agency.
- Member of the International Commission on Radiological Protection.
- Senior Advisor of the Argentine Nuclear Regulatory Authority and regular member of the Argentine representation before the IAEA Board of Governors and General Conference.

Over two decades, he was the Director for Radiation, Transport and Waste Safety of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

He has been the President of the XIIth International Congress of the International Radiation Protection Association (IRPA), Buenos Aires and former Vice-President of IRPA. He is founding member of the Argentine Radiation Protection Society.

He has published over 200 scientific and technical papers on radiation protection, nuclear safety and radioactive waste management, has contributed towards more than hundred publications of international committees and groups in these subject areas, and has managed several important international projects.

He has been honoured with several international awards including:

- The Sievert Prize, the highest international decoration in radiation protection.
- The IAEA Distinguished Service Award (in recognition of his work for the International Chernobyl Project).
- The Morgan Lecture Award from the Health Physics Society, twice.
- The 28th Lauriston S. Taylor Lecturer award of the US National Commission of Radiation Protection and Measurements.
- The IAEA "Special Service Award".
- The Marie Curie Prize.
- The Medal Academician Georgyi A. Zedgenidze, from the Medical Radiological Research Center of Obninsk.

He also shared the 2005 Nobel Prize granted to the IAEA.

Adèle Green is a Senior Scientist at the Queensland Institute of Medical Research and Conjoint Professor at the University of Queensland, Queensland University of Technology and Griffith University. She trained in medicine and later moved to a career in medical research focussing mainly on the causes, treatment and prevention of cancer, especially melanoma and other skin cancers.

Other research interests include the causes and management of ovarian cancer and care of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island cancer patients. She currently has a part-time appointment and several collaborations at the University of Manchester, UK. Adele is a member of the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) based in Munich.



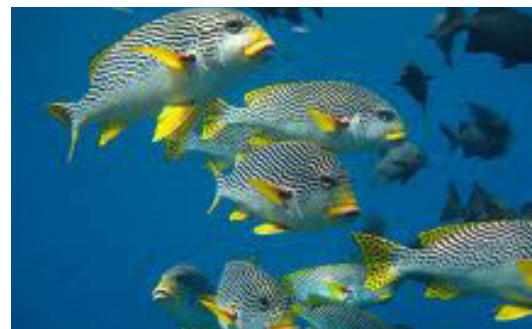

Mark Sonter

Mark Sonter's career includes 2 years as a high school science teacher, 6 years as a University Physics lecturer in Papua New Guinea (1970-1975), and 35 years in mining industry radiation and safety management.

Mark has a MAppSc in Medical Physics from QUT, is a member of ARPS and the Australian Institute of Occupational Hygienists (AIOH) and is accredited as an expert in ionizing radiation safety with the Australian Radiation Protection Accreditation Board (ARPAB).

Mark was directly responsible for preoperational baseline monitoring, EIS input, licensing and permitting, and implementation of radiation safety, in two uranium mining projects, Olympic Dam and Beverley. He has worked as consultant or RSO on many uranium, mineral sands, and rare earths projects in Australia and overseas, plus several contaminated site cleanup programs, and was a member of the Health Physics Audit Team for the Maralinga Test Site Cleanup.

He spent 2 years in a regulatory role (NSW EPA 2001-2003), where he provided advice on cleanup of contaminated sites, and on licence conditions for new mineral sands projects, and oversaw the licencing of the first medical cyclotron / PET facility to be built and operated under NSW regulatory control.

Over the last 5 years, Mark has become involved in NORM management in the oil industry, and in radiation predictions and planning for several Rare Earths Projects, required because of the thorium content of the ores.

Mark was a visiting scholar at University of Arizona Lunar & Planetary Laboratory in 1995, and during 1995-97 wrote a research thesis on the Technical and Economic Feasibility of Mining the Near-Earth Asteroids. He is a Founder and the Director of Mining & Processing, of Deep Space Industries, incorporated late 2012, which wants to go and mine asteroids!

Mark and his wife Wendy have two adult daughters, Katrina and Samantha, both of whom have decided to follow in Dad's footprints and are also Radiation Safety Officers!!

Risk Communication with the Media: Emergency Response for a Radiological Incident

PRESENTER

George Anastas

G Anastas Consulting, New Mexico, USA

George Anastas is a Fellow of ARPS and a Past-President of the Health Physics Society. He is a Certified Health Physicist, a Fellow of the Health Physics Society, a Professional Nuclear Engineer and a Diplomat of the American Academy of Environmental Engineers. He has held technical and leadership positions in industry, government and academia for more years than he will admit. During his career he worked with the media explaining radiation safety, nuclear safety and environmental issues. The media included national newspapers and television newscasters during video taped interviews and live television interviews. He also worked with elected representatives (State Legislative Committees), regulatory agencies (including the staff of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, numerous State and local regulatory agencies), the President's Commission on Air Quality and local activist groups on these same issues.

He received a Bachelors Degree in Physics from the State University of New York at Albany and a Masters of Public Health in Environmental/Radiological Health from the University of Minnesota.

About the Workshop

Effective Risk Communication is an important attribute for a radiation safety professional. Most radiation safety professionals effectively communicate radiation risk to other radiation safety professionals. However, many radiation safety professionals have difficulty in effectively communicating radiation risk or lack of radiation risk to non-radiation safety professionals, including the media. It is important to acknowledge that communication with the media results in communication with the public, First Responders, elected officials and regulatory agencies. Thus effective communication with the media is increasingly important. This 4 hour Workshop provides an overview of important considerations in Risk Communication and includes important communication lessons learned from the Kemeny Commission Report on the Three Mile Island Accident and the Japanese Report on Fukushima.

Each attendee will select one of a number of prepared radiation safety scenarios and George will interview each attendee, asking probing questions and Kent Gregory will record the interview (this is the before interview). After all attendees have been interviewed, George will present and offer guidance on how to respond to media questions. Then each attendee, using the same scenario, will be interviewed again and the interview will be recorded (this is the after interview).

Each attendee should bring a 4 GB USB drive to the Workshop. Delegates will receive a 'before' and 'after' interview. Accordingly the attendees may, at their leisure, review the interviews and practice responses.

Radon and Radon Decay Product

About the Workshop

Exposure to radon and radon decay products (RDP) remains the most significant source of radiation exposure to humans worldwide. It has significant impacts in mining and industry, and also has become an important issue for the home environment internationally. Since the early nineties the radiological protection approach to radon has been static but this is set to change with recent international studies and emerging recommendations from the International Commission on Radiological Protection (ICRP).

The current system for radon dose assessment is heavily based on epidemiological evidence determined more than two decades ago. Since then occupational studies have been updated and a range of epidemiological studies from radon exposure in homes have been undertaken. This has led to a change in the effective risk associated with radon and RDP which not only has an impact on radiation protection but also provides a fresh drive for the use of a dosimetric approach. Both of these were highlighted in a statement issued by the ICRP in 2009 which will result in significant changes in the practical radiation protection approach.

This workshop is designed to provide information and a forum for discussion on the approaching changes with respect to radon. It will utilise experienced rapporteurs to provide presentations on critical aspects and guide audience discussions on the issues. Attendance is recommended for anyone who is associated with radiation protection related to radon and RDP.
